

## ODMHSAS Announcement

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The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (ODMHSAS) was awarded a demonstration grant from The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to implement Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHC) pilots in Oklahoma. Oklahoma was one of 8 states chosen for this 2-year demonstration program. There are three CCBHCs in Oklahoma who are responsible for directly providing nine required types of behavioral health treatment services, with an emphasis on the provision of 24-hour crisis care, utilization of evidence based practices, care coordination, and integration with physical health. The three sites include NorthCare and Red Rock Behavioral Health Services in Oklahoma City and Grand Lake Mental Health Services in the northeastern area of the state.

For services provided to SoonerCare members, CCBHCs will be reimbursed utilizing a Prospective Payment System (PPS) based on actual and anticipated costs of providing services, much like Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs). CCBHCs will receive a fixed monthly reimbursement for every person actively receiving services at the CCBHC. The rates are specific to each provider and there are five separate reimbursement rates for distinct populations in addition to the base CCBHC rate. The monthly reimbursement to the CCBHC is intended to cover ALL services provided by that CCBHC to the client. However, this does NOT preclude a non-CCBHC provider (i.e. a non-CCBHC affiliated psychologist) from providing a service to a CCBHC client and being reimbursed through SoonerCare for that service. We do ask, however, that if you do provide treatment services to a CCBHC client, please make every attempt to coordinate with the client's CCBHC in order to ensure proper treatment coordination and prevent duplication of services. You can check to see if a client is in a CCBHC when you check their eligibility using the SoonerCare Provider Portal.
